	"I loved every day as a language assistant in the Escuela Oficial de Idiomas de Loja. In class with me, the students always seemed enthusiastic, curious, and willing to learn. They were of all ages, from 16 to 60, all of them voluntarily coming to the school despite long days of work or school. It was a pleasure to meet and speak with every one of them, and seeing them learn and grow was amazing and inspiring.



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I taught them about my culture in the United States of America, but they taught me much about their culture in Andalucia, such as the regional dialects, the food, the political systems, the work life, farm life, local economy, linguistics expressions (good and bad), and so much more. It was such a pleasure to talk with them that I volunteered to do private classes, during which I met with more than a dozen students.

I had a different role with each of my colleagues. Some allowed me autonomy to create and develop my own ideas, while with others I played a more supplementary role. I preferred the former, but overall it was a pleasure to work with them and develop different relationships with each.
